A THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Jesus Christ "is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and not only ours, But the whole world's. We can be sure that we know God only by keeping his commandments.....when anyone does obey what {God} has said, God's love comes to perfection in him/her."

1st Letter of John 2:2-3, 5a. Second reading of today's Mass

The sentences of St. John's letter flow easily enough in the stream of our consciousness without drowning us. It's easy to agree that Jesus' sacrifice takes sins away, to know God keep the commandments, obey God's words and God's love will be in you.

But how do I know that and "feel', (that terrible word) God's love in me? What do I have to do in my own life, how do I have to act if I am to be convinced of God's presence in its essence and in me and in others? One way to appreciate the presence of God in my life is to look at the lives of the Saints: some have immediate appeal, others have to be probed, others may not appeal to me at all, others are favourites.

Next Tuesday 16th April is the feast of St Bernadette of Lourdes and I think of her as an 'interesting' saint. The eldest child of an improvident father with a wife eighteen years younger than himself, she knew hunger and illhealth from an early age. With little formal education how reliable could such a girl be an instrument of God's mercy, mystery and love. At the time of the first vision of Our Lady to her, Bernadette was just 14 years old and had not even made her First Communion.

But it was the common sense, sincerity and lack of self-interest in relaying her message/story that eventually convinced the sceptical and anticlerical civic authorities, the villagers who "knew her family" and also, and importantly, the Parish Priest, that there was more to this girl than met the eye. Public and ecclesiastical opinion turned her way and Lourdes became, and remains, a centre of prayer, pilgrimage and yes, healing.

Of her own free will Bernadette became a Sister of Charity of Notre Dame at Nevers, at the age of 22 years, and never left that Convent until her death in 1879. (She was 45). In a homely way she said that Our Lady used her like a broom to do some cleaning and that she, Bernadette, had been placed in her corner. She remains an "interesting" Saint who did know how to keep God's commandments and God's love did come to perfection in her. I should like to have met her, would you?

Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15. 17-19

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate, after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. GOSPEL Luke 24:35-48

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

MUSIC FOR ST PETER'S

<u>Offertory</u> O sing unto the Lord text is Psalm 149 music Noel Rawsthorne 1929-2019 He was a liturgical and concert organist and composer. He composed for his own instrument as well as choral music

<u>Communion</u> Christ the Lord is risen again - Richard Shepherd. Born in Gloucester 1949, died February 2021. He was a British composer educator and director of development and was acclaimed as one of the most significant composers of church music of his time

Recessional Te Deum -Marc Antoine Charpentier (1643-1704) composed 6 Te Deums but only 4 have survived. Largely because of the popularity of its Prelude the best known is the Te Deum in D, originally scored for trumpet and orchestra.
