# A THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

".....unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain, but if it dies it yields a rich harvest." Jn. 12:24 today's Gospel

In John's Gospel we often come across the inversion of reality: what seems to matter most may have no real value; what gives meaning to the great issues of life is hidden from careless eyes. Sometimes we wonder about the purpose or value of what we do. We think our daily lives are humdrum. Will our families, will our friends remember our thoughts and actions; and what we have tried to teach them?

Faced with these questions I do believe that Lent is a graced time to think about the direction of our lives and to renew the generosity of spirit which gives more than it receives. Can I die to self to yield a rich harvest?

literacy skills, urban gardening, upcycling and income generating activities. They also have a clinic visited weekly by a doctor and community nurse.



# Monday 18<sup>th</sup> March: (transferred from Sunday) Solemnity of St Patrick: Patron of Ireland, Principal Patron of the Cathedral and Archdiocese

St Patrick, born in Roman Britain of a Christian family, probably in the late 4<sup>th</sup> century, was abducted as a youth by pirates and taken to Ireland where he worked as a slave, tending cattle. After six years he managed to escape or was freed and eventually found his way back to his family – a much-changed man. He took his family's Christian faith seriously, was baptized and after some study was ordained priest.

Then, as a missionary bishop he reurned to Ireland where he preached the gospel for the last twenty-five years of his life. (He died about 461). Patrick is venerated not only in Ireland but also in many areas of Europe, as well as in the United States and Australia where many Irish people settled after the Famine years of 1840s. Thanks to the vision of the first bishop of Melbourne, James Alipius goold OSA, our Cathedral was designed by the famous architect William Wardell and dedicated in honour of St Patrick.

Let us always be grateful to God for our ancestors in faith.



## POINT OF INTEREST

In the Sacred Heart Chapel of Our Lady of Lourdes Church there is a lovely pair of windows depicting St Patrick and St Brigid.

#### FIRST READING leremiah 31:31-34

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks - when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest – it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

# SECOND READING Hebrews 5:7-9

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

During his life on earth, Christ offered up prayer and entreaty, aloud and in silent tears, to the one who had the power to save him out of death, and he submitted so humbly that his prayer was heard. Although he was Son, he learnt to obey through suffering; but having been made perfect, he became for all who obey him the source of eternal salvation.

#### GOSPEL ACCLAMATION John 12:20-33

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. These approached Philip, who came from Bethsaida in Galilee, and put this request to him, 'Sir, we should like to see Jesus.' Philip went to tell Andrew, and Andrew and Philip together went to tell Jesus. Jesus replied to them:

'Now the hour has come
for the Son of Man to be glorified.
I tell you most solemnly,
unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and
dies,
it remains only a single grain;
but if it dies,
it yields a rich harvest.
Anyone who loves his life loses it;
anyone who hates his life in this world
will keep it for the eternal life.

If a man serves me, he must follow me, wherever I am, my servant will be there too. If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him. Now my soul is troubled.

What shall I say:

Father, save me from this hour?

But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour.

Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.

'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.'

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.

# "Holy Land Collection more vital than ever as conflict continues", commissary says

Two years ago, when Friar Bernie Thomas OFM, Commissary of the Holy Land (Australia), wrote to the people of the Church in Australia to promote the annual Holy Land Collection, it was the global COVID pandemic that was, he says, 'causing havoc for the people in the Holy Land'. Now, though, 'there is a new and more dangerous threat through the ongoing conflict, which may last for quite some time,' he says.

'Just when pilgrims were starting to return, the Sacred Places of our Christian Faith are once again closed to pilgrims,' he says in this year's letter, referring to the war between Israel and Hamas that has been raging since October last year, and appealing for the continued and generous support of Australian Catholics through the annual collection.
